Jane Frederick, AIA, LEED AP, Firm Principal: Frederick + Frederick Architects
Candidate for Vice President/President-Elect, 2010

The Vice President/President-Elect shall succeed to the office of President upon expiration of the term of the office of President. Among the many responsibilities of the office, the President shall exercise general supervision over the affairs of this Chapter and shall act as the Chapter's spokesperson and representative at meetings and with other organizations and committees.

Jane earned a Bachelor of Architecture from Auburn University in 1982 and is currently licensed in South Carolina, North Carolina and Georgia. She and her husband, Michael founded Frederick + Frederick Architects in 1989. Frederick + Frederick have been celebrated with numerous awards including three 'Honor Awards' in the Robert Mills Awards program, the Hilton Head Homebuilders' Lighthouse Award for best kitchen, and 'Best Home' for *Metropolitan Magazine*, among others.

Jane currently serves as Secretary-Treasurer of AIA/SC and on visiting teams for the National Architectural Accreditation Board that accredits all the architecture programs in the United States. She previously served on NCARB test writing and grading committees for the architectural exam for all candidates in the United States and Canada. She chairs newly formed Town of Port Royal, SC Historic Preservation Commission, researched and identified individual properties to be included in the district; developed preservation standards; and continues to oversee ongoing protection of the district. *These are some of Jane's selected accomplishments.*

Architects throughout the state are already extremely involved in their communities from green building initiatives to serving on planning boards; individually we are active but we need to harness the power of our collective voices to raise the awareness of who we are and what we bring to the table.

The Secretary/Treasurer shall have the responsibility to see that communications to the membership, Executive Committee and Board are adequate and correct and that records are maintained on the proceeding of the Chapter. The Secretary/Treasurer shall be responsible for overseeing the Chapter's finances, make recommendations on budget changes during the year; develop and monitor systems/controls for reporting income/expenses during the year and reporting status of the budget to the Executive Committee and Board of Directors.

David graduated Cum Laude from Clemson University in 1988 and received his Masters of Architecture from Clemson in 1990. David has been actively involved with AIA Greenville and AIA/SC throughout his career. He has served as president of AIA Greenville, and served multiple terms on the State Board in a variety of roles including YAF Director. He has helped with sponsor recruitment, soliciting conference sponsorships and in the establishment of the consultant directory in AIA/SC's *SC Architecture* magazine. He was an inaugural member of AIA National's Intern Associate Committee and is a past presenter at Grassroots.

Candidate for Lowcountry Director, 2010
