KEYNOTE ADDRESS: DRIVING PRACTICE & DESIGN,

10:15-NOON JAMES TIMBERLAKE, FAIA

For over two decades, Kieran Timberlake has designed beautifully crafted, thoughtfully made buildings that are holistically integrated to site, program and people. Established in Philadelphia in 1984, the firm has produced a diverse body of work for clients drawn to its environmentally ethical approach and history of innovation. The design community has recognized the firm for its fusion of research with architecture, bestowing over ninety design citations, including the 2008 Architecture Firm Award from the American Institute of Architects, the highest honor given to an architectural practice for consistently producing works of distinction. Citing examples from recent projects, Partner James Timberlake will take a provocative look at the role design research plays in the development of new form. Collaboration with other disciplines, novel use of technology, restructured organizational models, the cultivation of a deep environmental ethic, and assuming responsibility for what we build are explored as key drivers in the development of this new architecture.

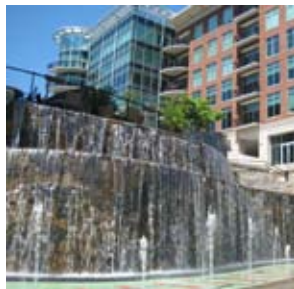

PEACE CENTER FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS RECEPTION

SAR 09 provides a twist on the regional design awards presentation. The Peace Center, a \$34 million complex, located on an historic six-acre riverfront site in Greenville's downtown, offers a 2100-seat Concert Hall, the 400-seat Gunter Theatre and an outdoor amphitheatre. The complex also includes the open-air Wyche Pavilion, a three-story restaurant/meeting facility and center offices, dressing areas and rehearsal space, all crafted from 19th-century structures original to the site. The lobby and Concert Hall will provide an architectural setting for this inspirational event. Tickets will also be available to the public.

DESIGN AWARDS

The South Atlantic Region leadership of the American Institute of Architects presents the only 2009 awards program to recognize the best in architectural design in Georgia, North Carolina and South Carolina. The jury, consisting of Chair Ted Flato, FAIA, Gary Cunningham, FAIA and Natalye Appel, FAIA, LEED AP will confer honor or merit awards on projects from the pool of submissions from licensed architects living in the South Atlantic Region. A special presentation will feature the award recipients during this portion of the evening.
